Here are some other things that will help you affirm and develop your God-given gifts...

- One of the ways you find out what your gift is and begin developing it is through other people's affirmation. They will say to you,
 "Wow! You're good at this." (this is one of the ways that God speaks to us/gives us His direction... through His people!)
- Another way is that you think something is "not that big of a deal" or "anybody could do it". If you will look around, you'll see that NOT EVERYONE CAN DO what you do. They probably think the same things about their gifts, but you look at them and say, "I can't do THAT!" Usually, spiritual gifts are something that we think is no big deal and anybody else could do it.
- Another way to tell if you are developing the right gift(s)/calling from the Lord for you is that you think what you are doing is what everyone should be doing or paying attention to in the church. Why isn't EVERYONE singing on the worship team? Why isn't EVERYONE going to the Dominican Republic? Someone has said, "Whatever makes you upset if it doesn't get done is probably what God is calling you to be involved in!"
